Principal's Message

Professional Development Day or In-service Day What's the difference?

Do you wonder what is meant by PD Day or In-service day? Some might ask, "Aren't they the same thing?" In a nutshell the answer is yes!

Both days are days of on-going study designated for staff to develop in their respective skills.

In-service days happen two times in the school year (September and January) and are days where the Principal and or Vice-Principal in a school sets, facilitates and guides the staffs' learning. In September, Sunset staff members and guests participated in a World Café model and we discussed and then created a set number of goals for the school year.

The goals that are established in our School Plan include:

- Effective communication to parents/guardians and students
- For all staff to be prepared to deliver, with confidence the new curriculum coming next September
- Improvements in student reading and writing
- Social Responsibility and for all students to have a sense of belonging

- Students participating in personalized learning activities/events
- Improving and mastery of computation facts for the respective grades

Four PD days are learning days for educators. The PD day in October is a provincial day and often teachers travel to various locations to participate/learn/plan/listen to implement new learning into their existing programs.

we have various drills so our students, staff and parents are well versed in the case of a true emergency. We have 6 fire drills, 3 earthquake drills and 3 lockdown drills.



Parents/guardians if you have not already done so, please be sure to have your emergency contacts clearly stated as we only release students to those you have identified.


