Principal's Message

Assessment Practices

As we continue to learn and prepare for the implementation of the redesigned BC curriculum, teachers and students will build upon their skills and practices in the area of student assessment. The purpose of assessment is to improve students' learning and teachers' teaching as data and results are interpreted. There are several types of assessment and guiding principles of quality assessment.

Formative assessment (FA) is intended to monitor individual student learning and provide detailed and ongoing feedback to students. Essentially, students show what they know or understand. FA guides teachers to recognize where a student or students are struggling and lessons are adjusted accordingly. There are six strategies that teachers implement daily to support FA. They include; writing the learning intention on the whiteboard to demystify what the lesson is about and what the student should be able to do after the lesson is completed. Teachers and students set or create clear criteria for assignments and projects. Clear criteria will give students a strong understanding of what they are aiming to get better at and offer opportunities for goal setting. Teachers provide descriptive feedback with suggestions on how to improve. Classes are engaged in thoughtful questions and students teach each other in the learning

process to expand and solidify their own learning. Students own their learning, feeling confident and take responsibility for applying necessary skills to complete their assignment, think about what's next, use time management effectively and can reflect on their own new learning. Formative assessment is an active cycle for students and teachers and is embedded in day to day instruction.

Summative assessment (SA) is a task or activity to measure a student's understanding as a culmination of taught curriculum and/or specific learning expectations. These assessments could be a test, essay, final project etc. Foundational Skills Assessments (FSAs), are a provincial assessment to collect a snapshot of how well the students in BC are learning fundamental skills in writing, reading and numeracy. These assessments are for grade 4 and 7 students. The assessment is typically taken in January or February of the respective years. Information from summative assessments can be used formatively to guide future learning.

Assessments are far beyond a simple mark like 16/20 or a comment of 'good work'!
Assessment practices are woven into a day's learning. Ultimately, through various assessments, the teacher provides the learner a path to make improvements.

Pink Shirt Day February 24, 2016

Did you know that Pink Shirt Day originated in Nova Scotia in 2007? David Shepherd and Travis Price distributed 50 pink shirts after there had been bullying behaviours displayed towards a student who had worn a pink shirt on the first day of school. In 2012, The United Nations declared to take a stand against bullying and twenty five other countries participated.

The anti-bullying movement is practiced day by day at Sunset School, going beyond one day in the year. Kindness is this year's theme and the national slogan is "Kindness is one size—fits all."

Students and staff will participate in Pink Shirt Day with NISS and Cheslakees school. Dignitaries from Port McNeill will also join the schools at NISS for an assembly, student presentations and a pink shirt school/community photo. Students are invited to wear pink shirts to celebrate kindness.

Thank you to Deborah Murray for her collaboration with school and community to enhance our students' learning and creative experiences and expression!




