This is my twentieth year of teaching - wow, that sentence just made me feel old. I have taught from grades 3 to 7, with my last couple of years teaching grade 6. I spent my first 3 years teaching in the Gold Trail school district west of Kamloops, and the last 16 years teaching at a middle school in Calgary. I am looking forward to meeting parents at the upcoming meet the teacher night, September 25, and getting to know the students throughout the year.

In the Event of an Emergency

The care of your children during an emergency situation is very important to us and following are our emergency procedures. These emergency procedures are practiced at school in order to have your child become familiar with them should an event happen.

Power Outage:

As you know we occasionally experience power outages. The decision to close schools is generally not made until the duration of the power outage is communicated to us. If a decision is made to close the school, all parents will be contacted and arrangements made for student pick up.

Fire and Earthquake:

Should either of these events occur, our classes will exit the building in a safe manner. Attendance will be taken and unaccounted for students will be tracked down. Students will remain with their class until they can be picked up by a parent.

Lockdown:

Should the school be required to go into lockdown, we have procedures to follow to keep your child safe. In this event do not attempt to contact your child via cell phone. Cell phone use during a lockdown is banned for all since a ringing cell can alert an intruder to students whereabouts. When the RCMP give the all clear, parents will be contacted and arrangements will be made to release your children into your care.
